

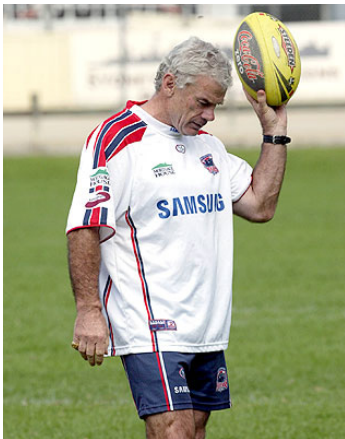

- getting the best out of your players/teams/stakeholders
- successfully co-ordinating your 'team of success'

- dealing with difficult personalities



CHRIS ANDERSON: Australian former rugby league footballer of the 1970s and 1980s and coach of the 1990s and 2000s. An Australian Kangaroo representative winger, he featured in Canterbury Bankstown's grand final win and captained Halifax to a Challenge Cup victory. He played 232 first grade games for the Bulldogs between 1971-84.

The formation of the Melbourne Storm saw Anderson become their first coach and he guided the team to Premiership success in 1999 when they defeated the Dragons. Anderson was appointed coach of the Australian Rugby League Test in 1999 and enjoyed five successful seasons before his tenure came to a halt after the successful 2003 whitewash of Great Britain. He is truly a living legend of the game.

TONY BOUFFLER: Hear directly from one of Australia's most successful sport managers. Manager of pro golfers Nick O'Hern, Karrie Web and Kurt Barnes, Tom knows what it takes to manage a professional sports person and the challenges associated with this high pressured, yet rewarding, industry. Karrie Webb is the most successful female golfer in Australia's sporting history with career earnings of \$16 million. Nick O'Hern played on the European Tour and now on US PGA and is he is the only player who has beaten Tiger Woods in matchplay more than once.



KURT BARNES: ICMS welcomes Kurt back to campus once more. Kurt joined the PGA Tour in 2003 and continued with victorious performances in 2004 Toyota Queensland PGA Championship (Von Nida Tour), 2005 Victorian Open (Von Nida Tour), and 2009 Sofitel Zhongshan IGC Open (Omega China Tour).

In April 2009 Kurt became the first Australian to win on the Omega China Tour after closing with an even-par 72 to seal a one-stroke victory in the RMB1.2 million Sofitel Zhongshan IGC Open in Nanjing. Barnes finished with a four-under total of 284, one ahead of Thailand's Wisut Arjanawat.
