

MORAN HOUSE

Dating back to the 19th century, Moran House is known to students as 'the castle'. The building started life as the first National Catholic Seminary in Australia and has a 'Hogwarts' romantic beauty which is in high demand for events, photoshoots and weddings, including that of celebrities Nicole Kidman and Keith Urban. The imposing classical sandstone building also doubled as Gatsby's mansion in the Baz Luhrmann's 2013 filming of The Great Gatsby, starring Leonardo DiCaprio. Resident students occupy the top two floors and have the convenience of most of their classes held just downstairs.



UNDER 18s

All unaccompanied minors (under 18 years of age) studying in Australia must have a carer, or guardian while in the country. Students should live with their carer and that person will be responsible for their welfare whilst in Australia.

On-Campus

The student has the option to live on campus in our student residences, Kelly House and Moran House. The House Manager will serve as the student's guardian whilst they live on campus at ICMS.

Off-Campus

Minors have the option to live in a 'homestay' environment. This can be a good experience for minors, as they will be placed in a home and will therefore have extra support and in most situations also have a 'host family'. The College recommends students use the company Australian Homestay Network (AHN) when searching for a homestay.
